

Gregory J. Basura

Dr. Gregory Basura received a B.S. in zoology and a B.A. in psychology from the College of Idaho. He completed his Ph.S. in anatomy and cell biology from the Wayne State University School of Medicine (2000) and his M.D. at the University of Washington (2005). He completed his residency in Otolaryngology-Head & Neck surgery at the University of North Carolina- Chapel Hill (2010) and a fellowship in neurotology-skull base surgery at the University of Michigan (2012). Today Dr. Basura is a clinician-scientist appointed with a 50% appointment in clinical otolaryngology and a 50% appointment at the Kresge Hearing Research Institute.

Dr. Basura's research interests include auditory cortex plasticity following hearing loss; central auditory neuroanatomy and neurophysiology; and the clinical spectrum of neurotology, including cochlear implantation, hearing restoration and skull base tumors, including cutaneous peri-auricular malignancy.
